

Maidenhead Bubble Boundary Walk

The Route

The Boundary Walk has small markers (see image in centre of map on the reverse) that may be followed. Each of the numbers in small grey circles on the map are the historical numbers of the boundary stones.

Those of you who are seasoned boundary walkers need to be aware that there is no river crossing the route takes a slightly different path to previous years, through Guards Park and the back of Braywick Recreation Ground, this is to avoid using the footpath bridge that crosses the river alongside the M4. We recommend you follow the revised route as the bridge over the river may be closed due to the motorway upgrade works.

We would like to remind you of the following:

- To avoid any possible congestion don't start at the traditional Boundary walk check points
- Be mindful that part of the route may be very muddy in parts if we've experienced rain, please take care to avoid slips and trips
- Choose a route and timing that will not inconvenience other members of the public
- Park vehicles appropriately
- Be careful when crossing and walking on our roads
- Avoid starting so late that you don't finish in darkness (it gets dark at around 6pm in late October!)
- Check on the weather and take suitable clothing
- Consider hydration and plan your refreshments, rests and toilet breaks
- Protect our environment, take your litter with you and look after your dogs
- Please consider using masks and gloves and ensure you have hand sanitisers with you.
- Please be neighbourly and keep noise to a minimum
- Tell other people where you are going and at what time, so someone can raise the alarm if you do not return.
- Make sure you have a support crew who can come and get you if you need help
- Ensure your phone is fully charged before you go and consider taking a battery charger with you
- Carry emergency contact details with you (think about track and trace)
- Please remember that this year we are not having a traditional Boundary Walk and support is not available from the Rotary Clubs, who cannot accept any responsibility for any loss to property or injury howsoever caused.
